Chapter 7 God's Heart/Emotional attributes

We serve an emotional God, one who stores the tears of the saints in a bottle. Look at how David describes God's response to his tears when the Philistines seized him in Gath: Psa 56:8 You have taken account of my wanderings; Put my tears in Your bottle. Are they not in Your book? The word used for book here is similar to a book of evidence or remembrance.

God listens to our prayers and sees even our

tears. Look at how he calls Isaiah to speak to Hezekiah: **2Ki 20:3** "Remember now, O LORD, I beseech You, how I have walked before You in truth and with a whole heart and have done what is good in Your sight." And **Hezekiah wept bitterly**.

2Ki 20:4 Before Isaiah had gone out of the middle court, the word of the LORD came to him, saying, **2Ki 20:5** "Return and say to Hezekiah the leader of My people, 'Thus says the LORD, the God of your father David, "I have heard your prayer, I have seen your tears; behold, I will heal you. On the third day you shall go up to the house of the LORD.

God rescues us from death and tears, distress and sorrow. Psa 116:1 I love the LORD, because He hears My voice and my supplications. Psa 116:2 Because He has inclined His ear to me, Therefore I shall call upon Him as long as I live. Psa 116:3 The cords of death encompassed me And the terrors of Sheol came upon me; I found distress and sorrow. Psa **116:4** Then I called upon the name of the LORD: "O LORD, I beseech You, save my life!" **Psa 116:5** Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; Yes, our God is **compassionate**.

Psa 116:6 The LORD preserves the simple; **I was brought low**, and He saved me. **Psa 116:7** Return to your rest, O my soul, For the LORD has dealt bountifully with you. **Psa 116:8** For **You have rescued my soul from death, my eyes from**

tears, my feet from stumbling. **Isa 25:8 He will swallow up death for all time, and the Lord GOD will wipe tears away from all faces**, And He will remove the reproach of His people from all the earth; For the LORD has spoken.

God is sometimes an Angry God. Look at how Asaph speaks of God's **angry** punishment of the Israelites: **Psa 80:4** O LORD God **of** hosts, How long will You be **angry** with the prayer of Your people? **Psa 80:5** You have fed them with the bread of tears, And You have made them to drink tears in large measure. **Psa 80:6** You make us an object of contention to our neighbors, And our enemies laugh among themselves. **Psa 80:7** O God **of** hosts, restore us And cause Your face to shine **upon us**, and we will be saved.

<u>God is a jealous God</u> Deu 5:9 'You shall not worship them or serve them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children, and on the third and the fourth *generations* of those who hate Me, **Deu 5:10** but showing lovingkindness (Hebrewkindness and mercy) to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments.

Deu 32:21 'They have made Me **jealous** with *what* is not God; They have provoked Me to anger with their idols. So I will make them jealous with *those who* are not a people; I will provoke them to anger with a foolish nation,

Deu 32:22 For a fire is kindled in My anger, And burns to the lowest part of Sheol, And consumes the earth with its yield, And sets on fire the foundations of the mountains.

Deu 32:23 'I will heap misfortunes on them; I will use My arrows on them.

<u>God experiences regret and grief</u> Sa 15:35 Samuel did not see Saul again until the day of his death; for Samuel grieved over Saul. And the LORD **regretted** (Hebrew-to be sorry) that He had made Saul king over Israel.

Gen 6:6 The LORD was **sorry** (to regret) that He had made man on the earth, and He was **grieved** in His heart.
