
Ron Edeal, MFT

Tired Men in a Busy World

Stress is inevitable
Stress tends to wear us out
Stress involves loss of some sort



How Are We Doing?

- What stressors/losses are in my life?
- Am I honest or do I keep it <u>secret</u>?
- First I must be honest with me!
- I could *confide* with safe people.
- What is a safe person?
- How many have a safe person?

What Do I Say or Do With Stress/Loss?

- Let's see what Jesus says to His disciples:
- Joh 15:12 "This is My commandment, that you <u>love</u> <u>one another</u>, just as I have loved you.
- Joh 15:14 "You are My *friends* if you do what I command you.
- Joh 16:20 "Truly, truly, I say to you, that you will weep and <u>lament</u>, but the world will rejoice; you will <u>grieve</u>, but your grief will be turned into joy.
- Joh 16:33 "These things I have spoken to you, so that in Me you may have peace. *In the world you have tribulation*, but take courage; I have overcome the world."

Jesus Prays for Them and Us

- Joh 17:20 "I do not ask on behalf of these alone, but *for those also who believe* in Me through their word;
- Joh 17:21 that they may all <u>be one</u>; even as You, Father, are in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, so that the world may believe that You sent Me.

What About This Grief, Weep and Lament?

- Solomon on Grief, Mourning:
- Ecc 7:2 It is better to go to a house of mourning Than to go to a house of feasting, Because that is the end of every man, And the living takes it to heart.
- Ecc 7:3 <u>Sorrow</u> is better than laughter, For when a face is sad a heart may be <u>happy</u> (pleasant, glad, celebrating).

Stages of Mourning/Grieving

- Shock/Denial
- Anger
- Depression, sadness and fear
- Acceptance

Many Men in the Bible were Honest with Mourning

- David mourns: Psa 69:1 For the choir director; according to Shoshannim. A Psalm of David. Save me, O God, For the waters have threatened my life.
- Psa 69:2 I have sunk in deep mire, and there is no foothold; I have come into deep waters, and a flood overflows me.
- Psa 69:3 I am <u>weary</u> with my <u>crying</u>; my throat is parched; My eyes fail while I wait for my God.

His Joy Returned

- Read the rest of Psalms 69
- He didn't deny his sorrow, his grief
- He looked to God
- It appears he was all alone
- We don't have to do it all alone
- He expressed his insecure feelings, but turned to God

Break the Silence/Denial

- When Christ was entering upon his sufferings he comforted himself with this, that his Father loved him. Seek that love!
- Pray to the Father-be vulnerable
- Connect with safe men
- Go to counseling (house of mourning)
- Maybe it's time to fast

Give Him Your Anxieties

- Psa 139:23 Search me, O God, and know my heart; Try me and know my <u>anxious</u> thoughts;
- Php 4:6 Be <u>anxious</u> for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.
- Php 4:7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your *hearts* and your *minds* in Christ Jesus.
